We hope to provide in this Centennial Edition of the 1976 Colorado Abstract of Votes as complete a picture of voting behavior as our data will permit. We, therefore, include tallies of the number of people actually voting at the polls, and both the computed NO VOTE for each election contest as well as the computation for registered voters NOT VOTING at all.

Computer techniques used for the first time this Centennial Year permit the presentation of data by district and by primary and general election. In each election contest, the poll book count is presented. The total vote for all candidates in each contest is then subtracted and the NO VOTE in that contest is abstracted as the last candidate. Total voter registration is also presented by election district. Those who did not vote at all are abstracted by subtracting the poll book count from the number registered to vote.

We hope this abstracted NO VOTE and NOT VOTING data will be useful tools for better understanding the voting patterns of all the citizens represented by the officials elected to be their government.

This Centennial edition is dedicated to these 1,104,739 electors who voted in Colorado's 1976 Centennial election year. These 82 percent of those registered to vote are the largest number of people ever to vote in a Colorado general election.
